- Have graduated with (or be in line for) a first class honours undergraduate degree or a distinction in a taught Master's programme from a UK/EU university.
- Agree to contribute up to six hours per week towards the work of the School, using your area of academic expertise.
- State within the online application form that you are applying under the HHS Home/EU Initiative.
- Meet the requirements to be classed as a Home (UK) / European Union (EU) student.

International graduates

If you have a first class honours (undergraduate degree) or a distinction (Master's degree) or the equivalent, and are from outside the EU, then you may also apply for a fee waiver scholarship.
