

Thirteenth Annual Working Meeting

Huelva, Spain 15-17 September 2022

Executive Summary of the Meeting

The Thirteenth Annual Working Meeting of the International Collaboration for Participatory Health Research (ICPHR) was held at the Faculty of Nursing at the University of Huelva (Spain) on September 15-17, 2022. Morgan State University (Baltimore MD, USA) and the University of Coimbra (Coimbra, Portugal) hosted the meeting in partnership with the University of Huelva. This meeting was held largely in-person, though there were a few sessions that were held in a hybrid format. The 60 participants registered for the meeting represented diverse disciplines and constituencies reflecting a cross section of stakeholders from 14 countries (Australia, Germany, Bolivia, Brasil, United Kingdom, Canada, Chile, Denmark, Ecuador, Spain, Netherlands, Portugal, Sweden, & United States).

The focus of the Third Annual Working Meeting (AWM) was:

- To provide a space for ICPHR members to come together for the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic
- To provide more opportunities for interacting in smaller groups and informal networking
- To provide an opportunity for individuals to share and present their work
- To review and identify existing and new topics and structures for writing and working together

The majority of the time was spent in smaller groups learning about members' projects and ways to get involved, as well as setting topics and structures for writing together. New & existing projects and initiatives to be introduced or continued by ICPHR members over the next year include:

- Communications Task Force: A small group will be formed to support the redesign and redevelopment of the ICPHR website, and to support the refreshing of the newsletter and other membership-facing materials.
- Membership Task Force: A small group will be formed to support the development of a new tiered membership structure, and to guide the implementation of this structure.
- Social Participation in Old Age: Case sampling on PHR with seniors during the pandemic, and a paper is being prepared.
- Methods in PHR: Based on the redefined goals of the group, new initiatives will be implemented regarding addressing the limitations and next steps of JPRM article, and to identify additional ways to advance PHR methods.
- Ethics in PHR: Efforts to compile case studies capturing the ethical challenges related to individual experiences of stress and trauma in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Kids in Action: Exploring the new frontiers of PHR with children and post-pandemic, and looking to collaborate with the Ethics Group and the Migration Group to collaborate on a discussion paper.
- New Group for New/Junior Researchers: To meet and orient new members to ICPHR,
 review existing efforts, and identify opportunities for involvement and mentorship
- ERASMUS Mundus PHR Master's Degree Program: To continue planning the modules and preparing the application for this program to be funded

The next Annual Working Meeting will be held in Dublin, Ireland in 2023.
