Fostering Public & Patient Ownership through Participatory Health Research

Meaningful public and patient involvement requires a shift in *ownership* of the knowledge creation process, from academics to community stakeholders. This repositioning of leadership and decision making power helps assure that research is producing the knowledge that will be most impactful for the those who need it, and that outcomes have the best chance of being sustained.
